The course can be offered in the Fall because it does not have to, be approved and accredited as an addition to the curiculum by the Board of Higher Education. The BHE does not meet again for reviewing new applications until the fall term. Since the technical writing course will be incorporated in English 11 sections, it does not have to be reviewed by the BHE. The English 11 course which is offered in the School of Liberal Arts and Science is an advanced composition course with a stress on training and preparation of factual material.
Chemical Engneers may use "Technical and Scientific Writing" in their liberal art's electives with approval from Professor Schmidt. All other engineers will be able to apply for the course, but they might be required to pay for the course.
