New Pink 'Campus' Publishes Following Five Paper Merger

A new daily student newspaper, The Campus, created by a merger of five undergraduate publications, begins publishing with today's issue.

The merger was enacted as a result of Student Government's recent economy drive to eliminate duplication and waste among the student organizations.

"It's bad enough we have one Moscow directed, left leaning, comsymp, slanted newspaper, without having five," said Student Councilman and YAF Field Marshall Stephen Von Schlashinger '69.

Unearth Plots Of Pink Bodies In Jasper Raid

A source emparrassingly close to the College's Administration revealed to The Campus yesterday that for the last two years the Central Intelligence Agency has used Jasper Oval as a "burial ground for troublesome pinkos and student operatives who had been found out."

According to the source, who requested anonymity because of his fear that he might become "number 57," agents from the CIA, posing as members of the Department of Buildings and Grounds, regularly "planted" 56 once well-known student activists as well as agents whose work, among other things, had been exposed.

Among the activists who are said to now reside 'neath the oval are the Roads brothers, Ricky, Rocky and Dusty. The brothers made news last term when they locked themselves in the bell tower of Shepard Hall, vowing to stay there until the College "let the students decide on matters affecting them."



So we must fight and fight we shall. We'll give it to em right in the kishkas, boy. Smek, smek, smek.



'CAMPUS' FACES LIBEL SUIT **OVER 'YELLOW JOURNALISM'**

Bubbles Gutfiend '69, The Campus' Pubic Relations Director, announced yesterday that she was suing The Campus for \$60,000 because of an article which appeared last

February.

The article contained a charge by President Blu Culager that The Campus had "descended to a level of yellow journalism which is indefensible" in its coverage of a report by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Bubbles, who had written the story on the Middle States report, said that in printing President Culager's "libelous" statement, The Campus had "descended to a level of vellow journalism which is indefensible."

"This callous disregard of the elementary principles of journalistic decency has been a great source of anguish to me and my parents," she said. "I was so upset that for a while I had difficulty getting my shoes off without taking off my bellbottoms."

"I'd be happy to testify in a court of law that we acted with 'malicious intent' if it will help Bubbles get her pants off," Ahlish Kodak, Editor-in-Chief of The Campus, said.

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
He disclosed that Dr. Culager had already instituted proceedings against Observation Post on similar grounds.
